LETTER OF CONVOCATION

The University of Granma (UDG), in coordination with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), and the National Association of Cuban’s Economist (ANEC in spanish), summons the “II Workshop on International Cooperation for Local Development (CIDEL 2013)” within the frame of the IV Cuban Local Development Congress to be held in Hotel Sierra Maestra, Bayamo, Granma, Cuba, from March 6 to 8, 2013. This workshop will, from the perspective of international cooperation for local development and an interdisciplinary form, reunite specialists and representatives from organisms, academic and scientific institutions, observatories, foundations, associations, representatives and authorities of regions, provinces, municipalities, cities and local governments, rural and urban communities, non governmental organizations and international cooperation agencies, to analyze and debate experiences related to this subject. Globalization, cooperation, climate change and food sovereignty. The Latin American Rural Sociology Association (ALASRU) in the current context of international cooperation.

Norms for the Short, expanded Summary and the posters: TITLE (Arial 12) IN CAPITALS AND IN BLACK FONT. ONE SPACE BETWEEN LINES AND CENTERED.

Authors: **Carlos Pérez¹; María Aldana²** (Arial 11 in black and centered font).

The text of the short summary must not exceed 250 words in Arial 11, sheet of 21,0 x 29,7 cm, 2,5 cm for all margins and simple space between lines; it must reflect objectives, current situation of the topic, methods or techniques used and results. Include three keywords which identify your work at the end.

Keywords: local development, society, alimentary sovereignty (Arial 11).

Norms for the Expanded Summary: Title, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results and Discussion and Reference (Author, Title, Publication, pages and year).

TITLE (Arial 12) IN CAPITALS AND IN BLACK FONT. ONE SPACE BETWEEN LINES AND CENTERED.

Authors: **Carlos Pérez¹, María Aldana²** (Arial 11 in black and centered font).

¹Universidad de Granma, Cuba; ²Universidad de Oriente, Cuba (Arial 10, *in black and italic*).

Works must be written in Spanish, in 21,0 x 29,7 cm sheets, one space between lines, 2,5 cm for all margins, font Arial 11. The text must not exceed 5 pages, with charts and graphics inserted within the text. All graphics must have a title at the bottom and charts at the top. The International Unit System must be used. Charts and Graphics in separate files will not be accepted.

The size of posters will have a total surface of no more than 0,90 m (wide) x 1,00 m (length).
